AROONA DAM

The heavy rain in early February resulted in the Aroona Dam filling back up, much to everyone's delight. However, the rain did manage to cause the yellow safety buoys to take off over the wall, these have recently been retrieved and are now firmly back in place.

On 1 April 2019, the dam was opened to non-motorised watercraft activities such as kayaks and canoes. The Leigh Creek Community Progress Association is currently exploring the possibility of the installation of a floating pontoon to assist in launching these vessels. February 2020 marked the one year anniversary of 30,000 Murray Cod and Golden Perch being released by RecFish SA and DEW into the dam. We are anxiously watching and marking the time off in the hope that in 2 years' time the fish will be a good size to catch!





Tree Management

AKURRA TRAIL



The Leigh Creek Community Progress Association received a "SA Healthy Towns Challenge" grant to create the "Akurra Trail" from the township of Leigh Creek to the back of Aroona Dam. In partnership with the Department of Environment and Water (DEW), National Parks and Wildlife Service SA (NP&WSSA), Leigh Creek School, University of Adelaide, OCA and the Adnyamathanha Elders, work has continued towards the completion of this beautiful trail. This has been a major undertaking, and is very ably being managed and guided by Rosalie Richards from the Leigh Creek Area School.











Exciting plans are developing at the school with the establishment of a Useful Plant Nursery, the aims are to grow native plants and vegetable seedlings and even prepare "seed bombs" to support local re-vegetation programs in the community.

LEIGH CREEK COMMUNITY PROGRESS UPDATE

With Daryl Bowshire as President leading the group, numerous projects are progressing for the benefit of the town. Exciting things such as the purchase of 2 vending machines to enable access to a selection of foods and beverages out of hours, the creation of a new website to showcase the town and surrounding tourist places to visit, improving non-motorised watercraft access at the Aroona Dam with a floating pontoon and as mentioned above the excellent work on the Akurra Trail.

With the COVID 19 outbreak and restrictions sadly a number of events planned have needed to be rescheduled to next year but work has continued in the background in hope to make the events even bigger and better. The Visitor Information Outlet (VIO) is set to open with the engagement of a part-time Tourism Role, so that together with trained volunteers the outlet can be open 7 days a week throughout the high tourist season. If you are interested in being a volunteer at the VIO please contact Daryl.

To enhance the visitor experience at Aroona Dam and the Akurra Trail the group are also exploring a potential arid garden near the main car park with the National Parks and Wildlife Service SA.

Discussions have also started as the group explore possible town entrance signs capturing the unique aspects of Leigh Creek.

LEIGH CREEK TASKFORCE UPDATE

The Hon Dan van Holst Pellekaan MP, Minister for Energy and Mining, established the Leigh Creek Task Force in late 2018 to provide him with advice regarding key decisions for Government. The Task Force is independently chaired and has senior representatives from the following Departments: Energy and Mining, Planning, Transport and Infrastructure, Outback Communities Authority, Education, SA Health, Premier and Cabinet (Aboriginal Affairs and Reconciliation), Primary Industries and Regions SA, SA Police, Office of the Industry Advocate, Trade, Tourism and Industry, South Australian Tourism Commission and SA Water.

The Task Force has now completed a review of the first two years of the transition of the town, including an examination of government service provision for the community. The Task Force has worked together to deliver better outcomes for the Leigh Creek Community, including the extension of lease terms through to June 2021 for all residential and commercial leases and the redevelopment of the town oval.

Task Force representatives were recently back in Leigh Creek, and met with business and representative groups following the completion of extensive community consultation undertaken in February and March this year regarding future township scenarios.

The Task Force recommendations on the future of Leigh Creek are now sitting with the Minister.
